

A true success story

Almost 1,000 sponsorships to school children, 900 successful school graduations, an aid volume of a good 1.1 million euros. These are success figures that none of us would have thought possible when we launched the Sunkids Project 20 years ago on a small scale. After two decades, the association and the people involved in it can look back on a true success story.

The foundation stone for this living example of international understanding was laid in April 2003 during a privately organised trip to Namibia. At that time, the rather primitive conditions at a primary school in Swakopmund caused concern and set in motion a willingness to help which has continued to this day and has grown steadily over the years. In 2004, the aid volume amounted to 7,500 euros, and today the amounts per year have reached six figures. Back then it was one class that was supported, today it is several schools. All of them are offered help for self-help, continuously and comprehensibly controlled on site.

The Sun Children Project thanks the local schools for their support and the establishment of school partnerships. This has created awareness on both sides and opened up further fields of activity. Sustainability and climate protection are now a matter of course for all those involved in the project. What has remained is the goal of providing the supported children with a good school education and vocational training, thus opening up a life of free self-determination for them.

The Sunkids Project is pleased that the financial support and voluntary work is now no longer provided by the members alone, but that the Foreign Ministry, Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development, Bingo Environmental Foundation, Lions, Rotarians, companies, local associations and countless other organisations have also joined in. "People like you and me" contribute. To mention the names of all the many supporters would go beyond the scope of this greeting.

For all this, the sponsored children from Namibia and I thank you from the bottom of our hearts.

Dear friends of the Sonnenkinderprojekt Namibia e.V.,

20 years of *Sonnenkinderprojekt Namibia e.V. is* another milestone that the Embassy of the Republic of Namibia in Berlin takes note of with great pleasure, because it testifies to success, commitment and above all perseverance.

On the African continent, we share a proverb in many different languages: A child who is not accepted by his village will burn it down to feel the warmth.

This expresses the responsibility we have as individuals, as communities and as governments to ensure the well-being of our youngest and, in the long run, of society as a whole. After all, a child is always a creation of all that an individual passes on. Surely we agree that the upbringing and education of a child is the sine qua non for building a successful and peaceful future for all.

Indeed, it is our duty to equip children and young people in particular, but also adults, with the knowledge, skills, values and attitudes needed to develop and create more equitable and sustainable frameworks and societies in an increasingly uncertain and unpredictable world.

Therefore, the focus on education in the activities of the *Sonnenkinderprojekt Namibia e.V.* is very welcome, as it is the key to development. It is an exceedingly noble goal to give every child and youth in Namibia a realistic and fair chance at a good education, especially children whose families are struggling with their financial situation. And in times of climate change, sharing knowledge and teaching action skills in nature conservation and environmental protection is an important priority that the Namibian government and our people share with you.

In this sense, the spiritual but also financial value of your work cannot be appreciated highly enough.

The list of schools you support in your *solar children project* is impressive - above all, your commitment is reliable and sustainable. You make it a point to ensure the rehabilitation and maintenance of the selected educational institutions and provide green energy not only for them but also for individual households through solar panels. The provision of affordable energy is a major developmental step for people to be able to shape and determine their own lives, e.g. it enables children to read and do schoolwork at home even when the sun goes down, and schools are able to prepare hot meals for their pupils, among other things.

We all know that child nutrition is a "long-term investment in human capital that yields a triple dividend, namely for today's children, tomorrow's adults and future generations", as our President, H.E. Dr Hage Geingob, stated in his *State of the Nation Address on* 16 May 2023. The Namibian government therefore continues to focus on food and nutrition security interventions: for example, in 2022, the government spent 104 million Namibian dollars (approximately 51,124 thousand euros) on the national school feeding program, which reached 320,000 children in primary and secondary schools. Although we have made significant progress in this area, many children are still severely malnourished today.

Nevertheless, we are pleased, but not complacent, that Namibia is one of the top performers in the region in terms of education expenditure in Eastern and Southern Africa. In the financial year 2021/22, we spent an annual average of 20.7% of the total budget on education and 7.8% of gross domestic product (GDP). With an average expenditure per learner of EUR 1,096, Namibia's total expenditure on education is relatively high in order to improve the quality of education. In the 2022/23 financial year, the Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture (MoEAC) was allocated N\$14.1 billion (approximately EUR 694 million). This corresponds to 19.9 % of the total budget.

This underlines the importance the Namibian government attaches to facilitating access to education, including for disadvantaged and marginalised children. Already 10 years ago, in 2013, Namibia introduced free primary education for both primary and secondary school. However, we still face other challenges. For example, many students have to repeat a grade, and low pass rates in mathematics and science prevent high-quality results, which in turn affects a skilled workforce. After all, today's children will be tomorrow's adults.

Non-governmental organisations like the *Sunkids* are important partners on the path of further development of our country. Every person in our society counts here. Only if we pull together will we be able to continue on our path successfully.

Finally, I would like to congratulate you on your 20th anniversary, which is marked by many years of active and hard work on behalf of the most vulnerable, namely the children of Namibia. I wish you strength and continued persistent commitment.

As our President remarked:

We as a government understand the need of our people to find work, shelter and food, but also to strive for self-fulfilment. Therefore, we continue to strive to improve the livelihoods of all our citizens, knowing that only through the creation of prosperity for all can peace be maintained.

Milestones

How it all began....

The Sunkids Project was founded on 11 October 2003 in the restaurant "Zur Post" in Neubruchhausen.

At the founding meeting it was decided to support the Namib Primary School in Swakopmund by setting up sponsorships.

At the suggestion of Namibia, the association was founded with the name "Sonnenkinderprojekt Namibia e.V.".

A great help was the support of employees of the tax office in Sulingen and the register of associations at the district court in Sulingen. With the advice and guidance, the foundation of the Sunkids Project succeeded in a very short time. The founding members remember this support with gratitude.

As early as 2 December 2003, the Sunkids Project was registered as a non-profit association in the register of associations at the Sulingen district court and on 18 December 2003 it was recognised as a non-profit association by the Sulingen tax office.

In July 2004, the former governing mayor of Bremen, Dr. Henning Scherf, supported the Sunkids Project with his visit to Syke.

In November 2004, Namib High School Swakopmund is included in the Sunkids Project.



At the beginning of December 2005, the first sponsored children leave the Namib Primary School and can attend the Namib High School with the support of the Sunkids Project.



In April 2007, Augeikhas Primary School from Windhoek joins the Sunkids Project.

One year later, at the end of April 2008, 180 children are already being cared for by the Sunkids Project. All schools are additionally provided with a four-digit amount to purchase teaching materials and urgently needed school uniforms for the sponsored children.

In June 2008, the Sunkids Project hires two teachers to teach German as a mother tongue at Namib Primary School.

On 19 March 2009, the German Ambassador Kochanke appointed Namib High School in Swakopmund as a partner school (PASCH) of the Federal Republic of Germany.

The "Drei-Freunde-Grundschule" Scholen becomes a partner school of the Sunkids Project on 18.07.2009, takes over a sponsorship for a child in Rehoboth and establishes an "Africa AG" at its school.

In February 2010, Rehoboth Primary School in Rehoboth becomes a partner school of the Sunkids Project.

The High Court of Namibia in Windhoek, as the highest court, registered the Sunkids Trust of the Sunkids Project as an Official Organisation on 07.07.2010.

In October 2011, the cooperation with the Naturfreunde International Wien, Landesverband Bremen begins.

21.02.2012: Climate scout training begins at Namib High School in Swakopmund.

On 20.03.2012, Swakopmund Primary School in Swakopmund is included in the **Sunkids Project.**

At the end of 2012, the Sunkids Project has 382 members and the aid volume in 2012 rises to over 60,000 euros.

In the first 10 years, the aid volume provided by the Sunkids Project amounted to over 280,000 Euros or 3,200,000 Namibian dollars.

At the beginning of March 2013, the Sunkids Project in Ondangwa installs a photovoltaic system worth 6,000 euros at the Okatale Combined School. This will ensure power supply at the school and the commissioning of a water well.

02.05.2014: At Rehoboth Primary School in Rehoboth, the Sunkids Project is building a new classroom for 22,000 euros.

In July 2014, the Sunkids Project donated 3,000 euros for the purchase of Pico Solar Home Systems. The solar systems are equipped with 2 lamps and a radio. This will finally bring light to the huts of our sponsored children in Rehoboth.

On 6 August 2015, the Sunkids Project applied to Engagement Global gGmbH (bengo) for a grant from the Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ) to renovate the roof of the Swakopmund Primary School.

The inauguration of the new kitchen building at Khomas Primary School in Windhoek took place on 10 March 2017. This new building was made possible by the "Lions Club Grafschaft Diepholz" with a donation of 51,545.00 Euros. The TSV Schwaförden donated 3,000 Euros. Thus, the new kitchen building could be constructed for 54,545 Euros.

The installation of a PC room at Khomas Primary School in Windhoek took place on 29.11.2019 There was great joy when the Sunkids Project was able to set up a new computer room at their partner school for approximately 21,000 Euros.

In 2022, the Sunkids Project embarked on its largest renovation project to date. The listed building of the Namib High School in Swakopmund had fallen into disrepair. The reason was the dilapidated and asbestos-contaminated roof. Thanks to a generous grant of 108,750 euros from the Federal Foreign Office in Berlin (Cultural Preservation Fund), the renovation could be tackled. The work was completed in January 2023. The renovation costs amount to 164,323.54 euros. The Sunkids Project contributed 55,573.54 euros to the costs.

Dear Friends and Patrons of the Sun Children Project,

Dear Arthur Rohlfing,

Even though the Sunkids Project has its cradle in Schwaförden, the radius of its radiant power is so large in the best sense of the word that it reaches as far as the small Saarland in the south-west of our Federal Republic. This has mainly to do with my mother-in-law from Diepholz. It is thanks to Ute Gorten-Dinkel that my wife and I were introduced to the idea and the work of the Sunkids Project very early on and that we have regularly sponsored children since 2006.

Since 2003 - 20 years now - the Sunkids Project has made it its mission to enable disadvantaged children in Namibia to attend school. Although there is no official school fee in Namibia, the schools are usually forced to charge parents a contribution in order to keep the school running more or less. Thanks to German sponsors, the association has been able to provide schooling for countless children.

In addition to sponsorships, the association also promotes infrastructural measures such as the renovation of dilapidated school buildings or the installation of solar systems, which help a school become self-sufficient in terms of its electricity supply. This is of great importance, as Namibia is still far from having a nationwide energy supply. Books and writing materials are financed as well as breakfast and a warm meal at school.

Unfortunately, even in 2023, the children in Namibia are still far from experiencing a carefree childhood and youth as we know it here in Germany, for example: While our pupils actually always look forward to the holidays - especially the summer holidays - the anticipation in Namibia of the time off from school is usually clouded because they often have to go hungry during the holidays because their families - they often live with uncles or aunts because the biological parents have disappeared or are addicted to alcohol - lack the financial means. This remains a seriously dark stain and a crime against young people.

In addition, the project is involved in training, accompanying and bringing together so-called climate scouts. The young ambassadors for climate and environmental issues thus perfectly bring together environmental protection and international understanding, elementary concerns of our time.

After the visit of Arthur Rohlfing and Carsten Putz in spring 2017, the Cusanus-Gymnasium had high hopes of sending young climate scouts from grade 10 to Namibia and thus establishing a long-term exchange. Good things come to those who wait - and when things were ready, the global pandemic intervened. However, I am confident that I will be able to set off again with the Cusanus-Gymnasium ... And I can certainly continue to rely on the support of Arthur Rohlfing and his team ...

Finally, in addition to the sponsorships and infrastructural support that the Sunkids Project has in its repertoire, there are also schools in Namibia that have decided to become school sponsors with German schools. Here, too, the project is busy, as the school sponsorship - in the sense of sustainable help for self-help - allows the concrete support of an institution, by means of which future generations of pupils may also experience how "their" school in Namibia is changing positively.

In the context of the visit of the Sunkids Project to the Cusanus Grammar School in spring 2017, which has already been reported on above, my school entered into a cooperation with the association and decided, together with the working group "Misheni Moyo" - which is dedicated to supporting social projects - and in cooperation with the Protestant Church of St. Wendel, represented by Mrs. Pastor Unrath, to support the Sunkids Project in many ways.

In addition, the all-day classes in Grades 5 and 6 have each decided to sponsor a child of their age. It is a wonderful story, considering that the children watch each other grow up and thus a bond is formed until the end of grade 12, which is also the end of high school in Namibia.

Dear Arthur,

I am very impressed that your team and you have succeeded in creating a new

20 years of doing so much good in the sense of solidarity, subsidiarity, humanity and international understanding in this part of the world - for which we as Germans also bear a special historical responsibility. 



Typical Namibian recipe

OMAJOVA

Omajova is the termite mushroom. You only get it when it has rained well, because then it sprouts at the termite mound. It is a relatively large mushroom and usually one is enough for 2-3 people. Omajova is usually eaten as a meatless meal.

1. Wash the omajova well and cut into pieces. Fry in butter with onions and season with salt and pepper. When the mushrooms are cooked, mix in chopped parsley. Serve with potatoes. You can also mix in diced ham.

OR

2. Wash the omajova well. Cut into slices. Season with salt and pepper and then toss inbreadcrumbs.Fry briefly in butter. Serve with potatoes.
